## **Hainault Forest High School and the International Red Cross Urgent Disaster Appeal.**

Hundreds of thousands of Haitians are awaiting the start of a global rescue effort in the wake of the country's devastating earthquake.

BBC correspondents say the situation is increasingly desperate, with no coordinated rescue plan so far and aid only trickling in.

The search for survivors continues but tens of thousands are feared dead and up to three million affected. Aid groups say there is a race against time to find survivors under the rubble of the collapsed buildings - the first priority of the rescue effort.

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement is the world's largest humanitarian network. The Movement is neutral and impartial, and provides protection and assistance to people affected by disasters and conflicts.

The Movement is made up of almost 97 million volunteers, supporters and staff in 186 countries. We will be asking our students if they can spare a few coins to donate to the appeals, during morning registration period on Monday. Any amount will be greatly received and promptly sent that afternoon.
